The bill reported by Mr. Teackle, from the joint committee on the library, entitled, An act to provide for the making of a map of the state of Maryland, and of each of the counties thereof, was taken up for consideration;

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to establish a House of Refuge for juvenile delinquents, accompanied with the following message:

By the Senate.

February 24th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We beg leave to return to your honorable body, and respectfully to submit to you for re-consideration, the bill which originated in the senate, and was rejected by your body, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to establish a House of Refuge for juvenile delinquents. We are induced to make the present request from a profound conviction of the utility of the proposed House of Refuge, and of the urgent necessity of such an institution to meet existing and imminent evils—and also from a belief that the appropriation of the fund as directed by the bill, is in accordance with the origin and first destination of it.
