Mr. Gantt from the select committee, submitted the fol-

lowing resolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Chancellor of Maryland be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to review the decision made by him on the claim of John Hepburn, as creditor of William and Robert Mollison, and to decide thereon according to the equity and right of the matter, without regard to lapse of time, or the technical rules of equity which prevails between individuals, and from the decision which the Chancellor shall make in the premises, the claimant may appeal to the court of appeals for the western shore, and any sum that may be declared to be due shall be satisfied by the treasurer of the western shore out of the funds arising from the confiscation, and sale of the property of the said William and Robert Mollison, which may remain in the treasury unappropriated.
