

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, An act to restrain, private Banking; which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

And delivered the following message—

By the Senate,

March 12th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The bill to incorporate the Mechanics' Savings Fund Society of Baltimore, was passed by the senate with the following amendments, which, however, it appears were accidentally omitted to be sent with the bill, when it was returned to your honorable body.

The amendments were as follows:—

In the 3d line, of the 2d section, strike out the word "February," and insert the word "April."

In the 6th line of the 2d section, strike out the word "February," and insert the word "April."

In the 3d line of the 6th section, after the word "deposits," insert the words "of any member."

At the end of the bill add the following section.

*"And be it enacted, That full power to annul the charter hereby granted is reserved."*

In consequence of the omission we have mentioned, we respectfully submit to you the propriety of reconsidering the bill, and acting upon it, as if returned to your honorable body with the amendments we have specified.
