

By the House of Delegates,
March 14th, 1832.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Hyde Ray Bowie, Charles Thompson and Edward Dubois, each eight dollars for two days attendance of each as assistant committee clerks to the senate, and William A. Quynn, and Richard Ridgely, each four dollars for one days attendance of each as assistant committee clerks to the House of Delegates.

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the senate.

A bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Willson, of the city of Baltimore;

And, the bill reported by Mr. Gittings, entitled, A supplement to an act, to make public an old road, leading from Coalsville, in Montgomery county, to intersect the public road from Vansville, in Prince George's county, at or near the Paint Chapel, in said county, passed at December session, 1823, chapter 184;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The report of the committee, to which was referred the memorial of John M'Kim, junior and others, of the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Mr Hunt offered as a substitute for said report, a bill, entitled, An act relating to Dugans and M'Eldery's wharves, in the city of Baltimore.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute;

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Johnson,

The house took up for consideration, the amendments proposed by the senate, to the bill, entitled, An act to blend Newtown (Trap,) and New Freedom, in Frederick county, into one by the name of Jefferson, and to establish boundaries of lots by commissioners, and to incorporate the same.

The said amendments were then read the second time, severally assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
