The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, to make public an old road leading from Coalsville, in Montgomery county, to intersect the public road from Vansville, in Prince George's county, at or near the Paint Chapel, in said county, passed at December session, 1823, chapter 184, endorsed 'will pass,' ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, An act to condemn and make public a certain piece or lot of ground therein mentioned, endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendment,' which amendment was twice read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of Jeremiah Hughes, endorsed, 'assented to,' ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following message—

By the Senate,

March 14th 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We beg leave to return to your honorable body, and to ask you to reconsider a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the citizens of Maryland, holding persons of colour to service for a term of years, and to prevent their absconding.—The object of the bill is of immediate importance, and we therefore, must solicit your reconsideration of it.

The said bill was then read.
