March 14th, 1832.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to William M'Neir, or to his order, thirty-eight dollars and forty cents, for so much due to him since the closing of the journal of accounts.

Which was read.

Mr. Brawner offered as a substitute for said resolution, the following—

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to William M'Neir, the sum of thirty-eight dollars and forty cents, for extra printing for the use of the senate.

Which was read.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute;

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said resolution was then read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Holmes submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate:

By the House of Delegates,
March 14th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the Senate.

We have received your message, suggesting that the adjournment of the legislature should be deferred until 10 o'clock this night, and that the Governor be invited to attend at 8 o'clock, in the senate chamber, to sign the engrossed bills and concur therein.

We have appointed on the part of this house Messrs. Holmes and Hood, to wait on the Governor for that purpose.

Ordered, That when this house adjourns, it shall stand adjourned sine die.

On motion by Mr. Wright,

Ordered, That the petitions and other papers relative to the pilot laws of this state, be withdrawn from the files of this house.
