Mr. Willson, of Montgomery, from the committee on en-

grossed bills, delivered the following report:

The committee on engrossed bills, beg leave to report, that they have carefully examined and compared the engrossed bills of the House of Delegates, from number two hundred and twenty-eight, to number three hundred inclusive, and from number three hundred and twenty-three to three hundred and thirty inclusive, and the engrossed bills of the senate from number three hundred and one to number three hundred and twenty-two inclusive; also, the resolutions of the House of Delegates, from number one to number one hundred and twenty-one, and from number one hundred and twenty-nine to number one hundred and thirty inclusive, and also the resolutions of the senate from number one hundred and twenty-two to number one hundred and twenty-eight inclusive, with the originals thereof as heretofore passed by both branches of the Legislature since the commencement of the present session, and that they have found the same to be truly engrossed.
