slaves from the state of Virginia into this state; which was read and referred to Messrs. White, Somervell, and Bourke.

The house then proceeded by ballot, to the election of Registers of Wills for Anne Arundel and Charles counties; in conformity with arrangement made with the senate for that purpose; and the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, it was sealed up and delivered to the committee appointed on the part of this house to meet the committee on the part of the senate, to count the joint ballot of both houses, and report the result; who having retired to the conference room, after a short time had elapsed, returned and reported—that on counting the joint ballot of both houses, they had found there were altogether seventy eight votes taken, of which number Samuel Brown, jr. received sixty-three votes, as Register of Wills for Anne Arundel county; - and for Register of Wills for Charles county, Henry Brawner received fifty-five votes; William B. Stone received five votes, and George W. Matthews re ceived eighteen votes.

Whereupon it was declared and resolved in the House of Delegates—That Samuel Brown, jr. be, and he is hereby recommended to his excellency the Governor of Maryland, to be commissioned as Register of Wills for Anne Arundel county; and that Henry Brawner be also recommended to his excellency to be commissioned as Register of Wills for

Charles county.

The house then adjourned until to morrow morning ten b'clock.

## WEDNESDAY, January 2d, 1833.
