a State Bank; which were read, and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Harris, Merrick, Pratt, Forward, Bourke, and Jenkins.

On motion by Mr. Johnson,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore report to this House the aggregate amount of revenue paid into the Treasury by each county, the city of Baltimore, and the city of Annapolis, (as nearly as can be ascertained) and the amount disbursed to each respectively, for the years 1828, 1829 1830, 1831, and 1832, ending 30th of November, 1832.

The clerk of the Senate delivered a communication from the Lottery Commissioners, on the subject of Lotteries; endorsed, "referred by the Senate to the consideration of his House;" which was read and reterred to the committee on ways and means.

The Speaker laid before the House a communication from the Clerk of the house, containing a list of all bills, resolutions, and reports, which originated in the house, and were referred from the preceding to the succeeding sessiòn.

Which was read.

The Speaker laid before the house a report from the Clerks of Baltimore and Queen Ann's County Courts, relative to the attendance of Judges; which were read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Also, reports from the Clerk of Baltimore County Court and Register of the Western Shore Land Office, relative to the several sums of money paid into the Western Shore treasury, within the year ending on the 30th November, 1832; which were read and referred to the committee on Ways and means.

Messrs. Willson and Worthington, the committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Governor, and inform him that a quorum of the house having convened, were ready to proceed to business, and receive any communication he might be pleased to lay before them, reported, that the committee had performed the duties of their appointment, and that the Governor had answered that he would transmit a communication to this house to-day at twelve o'clock.

Mr. Sutton obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled An act to authorize the granting writs of replevin by Justices of the peace, and for other purposes therein mentioned;
