Mr. Pratt, obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled An act to lay off the state, in Congressional Districts; ordered, that Messrs. Pratt, Somervell, Ely, Hammond, George A. Thomas, Bourke and Dennis, report the same.

Mr. Turner, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to establish Magistrates District courts in this state, and prescribing their powers and duties; ordered, that Messrs. Turner, Harris, Slicer, Bruff and Jump, report the same.

Mr. Compton, obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled An act relating to the duties of the commissioners of Anne Arundel county; ordered, that Messrs, Compton, Burgess and Ellicott, report the same.

Mr. Jones, obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled An act to confirm an act, entitled An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Somerset county, into election districts; passed at December session, 1831; ordered, that Messrs. Jones, Cottman, and Dennis report the same.
