FRIDAY, January 4th, 1833.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, A further Supplement to the act, entitled An act, to incorporate Frederick Town, in Frederick county;

The bill entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled An act, to repeal all such parts of the Constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Somerset county, into election districts; passed at December session, 1831;

And, the bill entitled, An act to alter and change the name of Luther Baker, of the city of Baltimore, to Martin Luther Baker;

Also, the resolution requesting the printers of the two houses of the Legislature, to forward copies of the public journals, to the editors of newspapers or public journals in this state, who may require them;

And, the message adopted by this house on yesterday, proposing to refer all that part of the annual message of the Governor, with the accompanying documents, which relates to the proceedings of the late Convention of the state of South Carolina, to a joint committee,

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Sutton presented a petition of Elizabeth Smith, of Harford county, praying for the passage of an act, to authorise the clerk of Harford county court, to record a deed of manumission therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Sutton, Johns, and Forwood.

Mr. Louthan presented a petition of Lucinda Rodgers, of Allegany county, praying to be divorced from her husband Arthur M. Rodgers, for certain causes therein mentioned
