Mr. Johnson presented a petition of Ishmael Vanhorn, of Frederick county, praying for the passage of an act to authorize him to bring into this state certain negro slaves therein mentioned, which was read and referred to the standing committee appointed on that subject.

Mr. Slicer presented a petition of Meshach Browning, of Allegany county, praying for the passage of an act, to make valid a patent for a certain tract of land therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Slicer, Ely, and Lantz.

Mr. Turner presented a petition of John Baker, and others, of Baltimore county; counter to the memorial of Isaac Kirk and others, praying the confirmation of a certain road therein mentioned, which was read, and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Willson presented a petition of William Lee of Montgomery county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county.

Mr. Forwood presented a petition of Thomas Magness, and others, of Harford county, praying that said Thomas Magness, may be placed on the pension list of said county.
