On motion by Mr. Teackle, he was excused from serv-

ing on the Committee on the Library.

The Speaker appointed Mr. Nicols, in lieu of Mr. Teackle, who had been excused from serving on that committee.

Mr. Teackle submitted the following message, which

was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

By the House of Delegates, January 5th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have appointed Mr. Nicols on the Joint Committee on the Library, in lieu of Mr. Teackle, who has been excused from serving on that Committee.

On motion by Mr. Jenkins, the house re-considered their vote upon so much of the order of the house, adopted on yesterday, as relates to communications from the respective states of Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Delaware; also a report and resolutions of the General Assembly of New Hampshire, and a communication from the Collector of the port of Baltimore,—referred to the joint select committee heretofore appointed on the ordinance of the convention of South Carolina.

Mr. Jenkins then offered as a substitute for said order the following.

Ordered, That so much of the Executive message as refers to communications received from the Executives of Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Hampshire, be referred to a select committee.

That so much as relates to the communication received from the Executive of Virginia, be referred to a select committee; and that so much as relates to a communication from the collector of the Port of Baltimore, be referred to the select committee on the inspection of Tobacco.

Which was read.

Mr. Ely moved to lay the order and substitute on the table.

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred, and was put on the adoption of the substitute;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Pratt then moved to lay the order on the table: Resolved in the affirmative.
