

within the city of Baltimore, showing the amount of capital disbursed under all the various heads of expenditure.— Also what amount of capital, per share and in gross, has been paid in up to the first day of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-three; and what amount of money, if any, has been borrowed by the company in aid of their funds, and the interest that has accrued on the same up to the said period:—Also, the annual amount of receipts and expenditures of said company, since their work was first put in operation to the first of February, 1833, distinguishing, under the head of receipts, the amount annually received from passengers and their baggage, and for the conveyance of the mail, from the amount annually received for the transportation of merchandize and other commodities; and showing, under the head of expenses, what amount has been annually expended by said company for working the said road, and for repairs, including the pay of officers, engineers, agents, and all other servants in their employment, and all other charges attending the operations of said road, and for contingences; so as to exhibit the nett annual profits, and the manner in which the same have from time to time been divided among the stockholders.

On motion by Mr. Merrick,

Ordered, That the Treasurer report to this house the amount of money actually paid on account of the stock subscribed for by the state of Maryland, in the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail-road company, or on account of interest on any stocks issued from the payment of such subscription. Also, the amount of dividends declared by the said company, and the time when the same were or will be payable to the state on account of the said subscribed stock.

On motion by Mr. Gitting,

Ordered, That the committee on Military Pensions and Revolutionary claims, be instructed to inquire into the propriety of placing on the pension roll, Mistress Ann Martin of Prince Georges county, late the widow of Adam Wykall or Vycall, a soldier of the revolution.

On motion by Mr. Merrick,

Ordered, That the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, be instructed and required to examine and report to this house the expediency of authorizing a subscription on the part of the State, to a work proposed to be published by Judge Dorsey, of the first judicial district of this State, entitled, 'The Testamentary Law of Maryland.'
