

On motion by Mr. Teackle, referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Mudd reported a bill, entitled, an act to prevent the unseasonable delay of justice, and accumulation of unnecessary law suits, in the courts of this State;

Which was read.

Mr. Pratt moved to refer said bill, to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Hope reported a bill, to be entitled an act to make valid the deed of conveyance therein mentioned.

Mr. Compton, chairman of the committee on divorces, reported a bill, entitled, An act to divorce Albert G. Franciscus and his wife Eliza J. Franciscus, of the city of Baltimore;

And Mr. Louthan reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a Turnpike road from such point as the Somerset and Cumberland Turnpike Company of Pennsylvania, shall fix upon, at the Pennsylvania line, to the public square;

Which were severally read, and ordered to lie on the table.

The hour for taking up the order of the day having arrived, the house resumed the unfinished business of yesterday, being the substitute proposed by Mr. Jones, for the report of the joint committee, on the subject of the South Carolina Ordinance; after some time spent therein in debate; The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
