The money actually paid by the State, on account of its subscription to the stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, has been paid for interest, on 4½ per cent. stock of the State, issued for the payment of that subscription; and its amount is \$855.

The Company has recently declared its first dividend, and its amount for the State, is understood to be \$1000, and to be payable on or after the 20th instant.

Mr. Schley presented a petition of the President and Directors of the Bank of Westminster, praying for the passage of a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the Bank of Westminster, in Frederick county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Schley, Unkefer and Hammond;
