

Mr. Ellicott reported a bill, entitled, an act to repeal part of an act passed at December session 1828, chapter 21.

Mr. Cottman reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the erection of a building for the accommodation of Somerset county court;

And Mr. Gantt, chairman of the committee on inspections, reported a bill, entitled, an act providing for the appointment of a weigher of wheat in the city of Baltimore, and prescribing his duties;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Jenkins, the house took up for consideration, the unfavourable report of the committee on divorces, upon the petition of Mary E. Stewart of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband William S. Stewart.

Mr. Jenkins then offered as a substitute for said report, A bill, entitled, an act to divorce Mary Elizabeth Stewart, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband William S. Stewart, a mensa et thoro;

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Compton, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him from the committee on divorces, entitled, An act to divorce Sarah Gilmore, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband David S. Barnum.

The said bill was read the second time and passed.

The hour for taking up the order of the day having arrived, the house resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the substitute proposed by Mr. Jones, for the report of the joint committee, on the subject of the South Carolina Ordinance.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute, it was

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, on the adoption of the report of the committee.

Resolved in the affirmative.
