

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, presented a petition of Samuel Raitt Creighton, of Dorchester county, praying that his name may be changed to Samuel Raitt Keene;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Wright, of Dorchester, Nicols, and Richardson of Dorchester.

Mr. Nicols presented a petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester and Caroline counties, praying for authority to change a part of the divisional line between said counties, at or near the village of Federalsburgh;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Lantz presented a petition of Rezin V. Hook, of Allegany county, praying a special act authorising the sale of certain real estate in said county, for the promotion of the interest of certain devisees named in the will of John S. Hook, late of Allegany county deceased;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lantz, Slicer and Bruce.

Mr. Roberts presented a petition of Gerald Coursey and others, of Queen Anne's county, praying the repeal of the acts of Assembly, authorising gates to be kept on the public roads of said county, and the privileges of erecting the same free from tax;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Roberts, Larimore and Wright of Queen Anne's.

Mr. Harding presented a petition of Alfred Lee, of the State of Ohio, (now confined in the Jail of Montgomery county,) praying for a special act of insolvency;

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Mr. Hope presented a petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying the passage of a law to call a Convention of the people of Maryland;

And, Mr. Unkefer presented a petition of Frederick Stembel, George Titlow and others, of Frederick county, praying for a Convention, to reform the constitution of the State;

Which were read and severally referred to the committee on the constitution.

The Speaker laid before the house a report of the Sheriff of Worcester county, relative to monies paid into the Treasury of the Eastern Shore, within the year ending on the 30th of November, 1832;
