And Mr. Grove reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Washington county, to record the deed therein mentioned;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the Senate delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, an act, vesting certain powers in the President of the United States;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Also, delivered a memorial of Lawis Motter and others, praying for the passage of an act relating to the Westminster, Taneytown and Emmittsburgh Turnpike Road Company, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of Delegates;"

Which was read and also referred to the committee on internal improvement.

The resolution in favour of James Harrison of William, of Talbot county;

And the resolutions relative to the Ordinance of Nullification, of South Carolina; were sent to the Senate.

On motion by Mr. Harper, the house took up for consideration the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice, relative to a work on the testamentary law of the State of Maryland, proposed to be published by the honourable Clement Dorsey, associate judge of the first judicial district.

Mr. Nicols moved to amend the resolution by striking out in the fourth line, the words, "two hundred," and insert in lieu thereof "one hundred and fifty."

On motion by Mr. Turner, the house was called, and the door keeper sent for the absent members.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary bussiness of the session, during the absence of the door keeper.

On motion by Mr. Rogerson, the house took up for consideration, the favourable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, upon the petition of Sally Hillman, widow of William Hillman, a revolutionary soldier.
