

TUESDAY, February 12th 1833.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Gilmore of the city of Baltimore, from her husband David S. Barnum;

The resolution in favour of Sally Hillman, of Somerset county, and the resolution authorising the treasurer of the western shore to pay unto his Excellency the Governor, or his order, for the purpose of purchasing furniture for the government house; the sum of one thousand dollars, were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the court of Dorchester county, to make valid, the sale of certain real estate to Anthony Thompson, by commissioners therein named, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Lantz presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying a law may pass authorising the commissioners of said county, to purchase land and erect a poor house thereon, which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Lantz, also presented a petition of John B. Armistead, praying a special act, granting him permission to pay into the treasury, the amount of composition money, that ought to have been paid on or before the 20th of December, 1832, to compound on a survey made for him in Allegany county, of a tract of land called "Internal Improvement." Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lantz, Gantt, and Schley.

Also, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying aid from the state to erect a bridge across the Yohogany, in said county, which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Ellicott presented a petition of Richard Cromwell, and others; praying the passage of a law to make public a road therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Ellicott, Duvall, of Anne-Arundel, and Burgess.

Mr. Johns presented a petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying the passage of a law to build a bridge over Winters run, at or near the crossing place, on the road leading from Gunpowder neck, to Belle Air; which was read and referred to Messrs. Johns, Forwood, and Sutton.

Mr. Harper presented a petition of Edward Nicholas of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from his wife
