

WEDNESDAY, February 13th 1833.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion by Mr. Forwood,

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal, that the absence of Mr. Hope is occasioned by the death of a near relative.

Mr. Bourke presented a petition of the trustees of Centreville Academy, praying to restore the Academy to its former standing, by continuing to it the donation from the state;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bourke, Wright of Queen Ann's, and Larrimore.

Mr. Burgess presented a petition of Emeline Duvall, of Anne Arundel county, praying to be divorced from her husband Alexander Duvall;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Pratt presented a petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county; praying the passage of a law, authorising the Levy court of said county, to enlarge the office of the Register of Wills of said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Pratt, Edelen and Gantt

Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, praying the repeal of an act of Assembly, passed March 10th 1827, chapter 212, entitled, An act to provide for the valuation and condemnation of the waters at the mouth of Cambridge creek, in Dorchester county, for the erection of a tide mill.

Mr. Turner presented a petition of Elizabeth Owen of Baltimore city, praying that her husband Thomas B. Owen be appointed trustee of her property and that of her children:

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice,

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying that the regulations of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, as established under an act, passed at December session 1830, chapter 117, may be restricted, and that the second, third, and fourth sections of said act may be repealed;

And, Mr. Powell presented a memorial and petition of sundry citizens of Worcester and Somerset counties, pray-
