Mr. Turner moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following—

And be it enacted, That in no instance shall the clerk of any county court, be permitted to grant a license to vend spiritous liquors to any person who lives within two miles of any camp meeting, who does not keep a regular public house, except upon the recommendation of a judge or judges of the county court.

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Millar, said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following—

And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to require persons to take out a license for the sale of cider or small beer, made by the person offering to vend the same.

Mr. Teackle moved further to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof the following, as an additional section—

And be it enacted, That the last section of an act passed at December session. 1825, chapter 113, entitled, an act to authorise limited partnerships in this state, be and the same is hereby repealed—Provided, That every partnership which may be formed according to the provisions of this act, shall be subject to the full effect and operation of the act to which this is “a further additional supplement,” and the several supplements thereto;

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.
