Mr. Merrick presented a petition of Harriet Oliver of Charles county, praying to be placed upon the pension list of said county.

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessments.

Mr. George A. Thomas, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying that a company may be incorporated to make a Turnpike road from Conowingo, to the Pennsylvania line.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. George A. Thomas, Lewis Thomas, and Evans.

Mr. Jenkins presented a petition of Elizabeth Nes of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce from her husband Samuel Nes.
