

Mr. Harper submitted the following resolution;

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the State Librarian, be, and he is hereby authorised under the direction of the joint committee on the State Library to exchange or otherwise dispose of, the "Proceedings and Debates of the Virginia State Convention of 1829—'30;" and the proceeds of the same be expended in the purchase of other books for the use of the said Library.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Mr. Merrick from the committee on Internal Improvement, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled An act vesting certain powers in the President of the United States, reported the same with the following amendment:

Amendment Proposed.

Strike out all after the word "made," in the last line of the first section—and insert in lieu thereof, the words "whenever the same may respectively be necessary along the line of said road."

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Cottman, (seconded by two other members who voted in the majority) the house reconsidered their vote upon the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Somerset and Worcester Rail-road Company.

On motion by Mr. Cottman, said bill was recommitted to the committee on Internal Improvement.

Mr. Jenkins reported a bill entitled, An act to authorise the extension of Cathedral street, and the closing up a part of Liberty street in the city of Baltimore:

Mr. Lewis Thomas reported a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the rebuilding of a bridge over Conowingo creek at or near Abijah Fenns in Cecil county, passed at December session, 1831, chap. 73.

Mr. Wright of Dorchester, reported a bill entitled, An act to limit the time for entering and filing caveats to last wills and testaments, and for other purposes.

Mr. Hollman reported a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of John Hamilton, George Hamilton, James Rench, Thomas Rench, Sarah Bowen, and William C. Bowen;
