TUESDAY, January 14th, 1834.

Cummins and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins, deceased, of the state of Delaware, to remove into the said state a negro woman named Rachel, and to sell the same in said state in which said negro woman the said John Cummins possessed an unexpired term, were sent to the senate.
