On motion by Mr. Nicols,

Ordered, That the reference made yesterday, of the memorial of the Medical Faculty of the University of Maryland to the committee on Education be reconsidered and referred to a select committee, to consist of five members.

Whereupon the Speaker appointed Messrs. Nicols, Jones of Baltimore city, Pratt, Palmer and Wharton.

Mr. Berry submitted the following order,

Ordered, That the special committee to whom was referred the instruction to propose or report to this house by bill or otherwise, the establishment of magistrates courts and better regulation of the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in the several counties in this state, be extended to seven.

Which was twice read, and the question put, "will the house adopt the order."

Resolved in the affirmative.

Whereupon the Speaker appointed Messrs. Berry and Handy on the said committee.

On motion by Mr. Spencer,

Ordered, That the committee on internal improvement be instructed to call on the President and Directors of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company for a statement of the financial condition and prospects of said company.
