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FRIDAY, January 31st, 1834.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to prevent partiality in sales by auction of deceased persons estates;

And, the resolution authorising the Treasurer to liquidate and pay the postage of the members, were sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road company, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Schley presented a petition of the officers and managers of the Union Female Free School of Frederick and others, praying a donation as therein expressed;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Palmer presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for a law to incorporate a Savings Institution, at Mechanic's Town, in said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Palmer, Schley and Sifford.

Mr. Wharton presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of an act to extend the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in said county;

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the senate.

Mr. Jones of Balt. city, presented a memorial of S. and S. O. Hoffman and others, owners of property on Poppleton street, in the city of Baltimore, praying that the width of said street, between Baltimore and Pratt streets may be reduced;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jones of Balt. city, Price and Moores;

Also, presented a memorial of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, praying that the salaries of the associate judges of Baltimore city court may be paid by the state;
