On motion by Mr. Ely, the house reconsidered their vote on the adoption of the amendment proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the Mechanic's Saving Fund Society of Baltimore.

Mr. Ely then moved to amend the said amendment by inserting after the word, "member" the words, "or stockholder."

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Ely then moved for a second reading by special order of said amendment.

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him as chairman of the committee on internal improvement, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a Rail-road, from Baltimore, to the city of Washington.
