

sent session of the Legislature in two of the newspapers, of the city of Baltimore, and in two newspapers in the city of Philadelphia, and in one newspaper in each of the counties in this state, in which a newspaper is printed, the following act of the present session to wit: an act to prevent the destruction of oysters, in the waters of this state.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, submitted the following order, which was twice read;

Ordered, that the clerk of the Executive Council be required to cause to be published forthwith in two of the newspapers of the city of Baltimore, and in one of the newspapers in each of the counties, in which a newspaper is printed, the following acts of the present session, to wit:

1. A further supplement to an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools, in the several counties therein named.

2. A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers.

3. A further supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves.

4. A further supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to sheriffs and for other purposes.

5. A supplement to an act entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one system the laws to direct descents.

6. An act to encourage the more effectual apprehending of runaway servants and slaves.

7. A supplement to the act entitled, an act for the education of deaf and dumb.

8. An act entitled, an act to extend the powers of the chancery court and the county courts as courts of equity.

9. A further supplement to an act entitled, an act to regulate the public ferries.

10. A further supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to the people of colour in this state, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 281.

11. A supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to the importation of passengers.

12. An act relating to Mortgages.

On motion by Mr. Lantz, the said order was amended by inserting after the word "counties," in the 4th line, these words, "one of which shall be the Cumberland Advocate."

The order was then adopted as amended.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset submitted the following order, which was twice read and adopted.
