

Ordered, That the clerk of the Executive Council be required to cause to be published in the newspaper printed in Somerset county, the following act of the present session, to wit: an act to amend the constitution and form of government as it relates to the division of Somerset county into election districts, and to establish an additional election district.

Mr. Merrick, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the memorial of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying the grant of a sum of money sufficient to open a ditch through a swamp therein mentioned, made an unfavorable report thereon;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and concurred in.

Mr. Johns, from the select committee to which was referred the petition of John Norris, of Harford county, made an unfavorable report thereon;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and concurred in.

Mr. Merrick submitted the following message;
