Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Nicols, seconded by two other members who voted in the majority, the house reconsidered the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to extend to the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road company certain privileges and powers heretofore granted to the Baltimore and Ohio Rail road company.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

Mr. Blakistone submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned sent to the senate.

By the House of Delegates,
March 15th, 1834

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return you the bill entitled, an act making it penal to sell certain property under certain circumstances, and respectfully ask a reconsideration. The facts which have been presented to us, call loudly for legislative interference. Slaves have been replevied out of the possession of their rightful owners, and sold to Foreigners by persons having no colour of title to the property, and thus deprived their owners of all possibility of regaining their property as the present law contemplates, we therefore hope your honorable body will pass the bill.

On motion by Mr. Crabb,

The house proceeded to take up for consideration the resolutions from the senate disapproving of the removal of the deposits from the Bank of the United States.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, the house was called and the sergeant at arms sent after the absent members, viz. Messrs. Griffith, Smith, of Wor. and Grove.

The sergeant at arms having returned reported that in obedience to the order of the house he had notified Mr. Grove, one of the absent members, that his attendance in the house was required, and that he was now attending—the other two absent members, Messrs. Griffith, and Smith of Worcester, he could not find.

The house then resumed the consideration of the resolutions from the senate disapproving the removal of the deposits from the Bank of the United States.
