So the resolutions were rejected, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Crabb moved that Mr. Lantz, who was absent when the vote was taken be permitted to record his vote; the Speaker decided this motion not to be in order, that Mr. Lantz could not be permitted to record his vote unless by the unanimous consent of the house, and there being an objection, his vote could not be recorded.

On motion by Mr. Lantz, he was then permitted by the house to have entered on the journal of proceedings as follows:

“That he dissents from the resolutions of the senate relative to the Bank deposits. His reasons are that the course of the present administration in relation to this subject, in his opinion perfectly comport with the true spirit and meaning of the constitution according to the original design and intent of the framers thereof, and that to avoid the introduction of a monied aristocracy in this republic, the course of the present administration on that subject is wise and wholesome; well calculated to prevent in future the probable influence of monied institutions in governmental matters, no matter by what name they may be introduced, because their influence might lead to a corrupt effect upon the wholesome and virtuous principles of the honest yeomanry of our state.

On motion by Mr. Carroll, permission was granted by the house to have entered on the journal of proceedings as follows:

We the undersigned voted against the resolutions from the senate, and against those which originated in the House of Delegates, with regard to the removal of the deposits, on the ground that there was no necessity for such a proceeding, as it is a subject peculiarly belonging to the general government. In our private opinion, we are opposed to the removal of the deposits; but not wishing to pledge the opinion of this state through its representatives, without being certain of the sentiments of our constituents, which we are always ready to obey, and of those of the people of this state, we resolved to vote against any pro-
