

And Mr. Ely presented a petition of Thomas Crampton, of Baltimore county, a revolutionary soldier, severally praying to be placed on the pension roll;

Which were severally read, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, presented the petitions of Matthew Scott, Orramel Tower and William B. Buchanan, of the city of Baltimore, severally praying for a special act of insolvency;

And, Mr. Cushing presented a memorial of George Torrance, of the city of Baltimore, counter to the petition of William B. Buchanan, praying for special acts of insolvency;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Mr. Harlan presented a petition of Benjamin Sargeant, of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act authorising him to sell a certain tract of land in said county;

Which was read, and referred to Messrs. Harlan, Scott and Bussey.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Somerset county, praying the passage of an act, to authorise and require the levy court of said county, to levy annually upon the taxable property of said county, a sum of money, to be paid to the President and Directors of the Nanticoke Bridge Company, for the privilege to the residents of said county, of passing the bridge over the Nanticoke river, at Vienna, without paying toll.

Which was read, and referred to Messrs. Jones, of Somerset, Cottman and Dashiell.

Mr. Harding presented petitions from John B. Yates, Sarah Bayley, and Mary Whelan, of Montgomery county, severally praying to be placed on the pension list of said county.

Which were read, and severally referred to the committee on indigent persons, by county assessment.

Mr. Kershner, presented a petition of J. J. Merrick, in behalf of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying a settlement of the claims of the militia called out in January 1834, and of certain persons who furnished supplies for them,

Which was read and referred to the committee on claims;

And, Mr. Jones of Baltimore, presented a memorial of George W. Deems, Adi Pindall, James Darling and others. The speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk
