

following terms—that where any communication, report, or other document shall be ordered to be printed, by the House, or Senate, the clerks of the Houses respectively, shall ascertain whether the same has been previously ordered or required by the other house, if so, the copies shall be furnished by the Senate's printer for the use of the House, or by the printer to the House for the use of the Senate, and when the same person shall be printer to both Houses of the Legislature, and any communication, report, or other document, be communicated to both houses, and printed by the house or senate, the printer shall charge for the same at the rate allowed by the contract for press work, including paper, folding, and stitching, but excluding composition.
