Mr. Jones, of Somerset, submitted the following resolution, which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be hereby authorised and required, as soon as he conveniently can, to furnish and transmit to the Clerk of Somerset County Court, for the use of said Court, one bound copy of the laws of Maryland, from the year 1818, to the present time; and to the Register of Wills for Somerset county, for the use of the said Register, and of the Orphan's Court of said county, one bound copy of the said laws, for the said period of time.

Mr. Williams submitted the following resolution, which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be and he is hereby authorised to furnish two complete sets of the Laws of this State, from the State Library, so far as they can be spared from the same, and to purchase the deficiency, if any, and the treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay the cost thereof, on the librarian certifying the cost of said books, which may be purchased under this resolution. One copy to be left at the office of the clerk of Worcester county, for the use of the court thereof; the other copy to be left at the Register of Wills' office, for the use of the Orphan's Court of said county, to supply the loss of those destroyed by the late fire at Snow Hill, in said county.

On motion by Mr. Teackle,

Ordered, That the treasurer of the Western Shore report to this house the statements of the several Banks of this State, required in obedience to their respective charters.

Messrs. Hood and Gantt, the committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Governor, and inform him that a quorum of the house having convened, were ready to proceed to business, and receive any communication he might be pleased to lay before them, reported that the committee had performed the duties of their appointment, and that the Governor had answered, that he would transmit a communication to the house to day at half past 12 o'clock.
