And, Mr. Jones of Baltimore, reported a bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, passed at December session, 1832, to incorporate the Fell's Point Savings Institution.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and

ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the Council delivered the following communication from the Executive.

Mr. Jones of Baltimore, submitted the following order.

Ordered, That five hundred copies of the Governor's Message be printed for the use of the members of the Legislature.

On the question being put on striking out, it was resolv-

ed in the affirmative.

Mr. Gantt then moved to fill the blank with "seven hundred and seventy-seven."

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on filling the blank with "seven hundred and fifty."

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said order was then read the second time as amend-

ed, and adopted.

Mr. Wharton moved that the house take up the message submitted by him, proposing to go into the appointment of a United States Senator on Saturday the 3d inst.

Mr. Nicols moved that the house adjourn.

Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, will the house take np the message.

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said message was then read the second time, and assented to.

The house then adjourned until tomorrow morning ten o'clock.
