

MONDAY, January 5th, 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolutions requiring the librarian to transmit copies of the laws of this state to the clerks and registers of wills of Somerset and Worcester counties;

Also, the message proposing an interchange of services between the Rev. Mr. Davis, and the Rev. gentleman appointed by the senate to perform divine worship;

Also, the resolution authorising the treasurer to pay to the several members of the General Assembly and the officers thereof, the several sums of money now due, or that may from time to time become due to them respectively;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of William B. Buchanan;

And the bill, entitled, an act to authorise and empower J. H. Bayne, of P. Georges county, to sell and dispose of his negro woman Mary, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Wharton asked leave to withdraw the message submitted by him on Thursday the 1st inst. proposing to go into the appointment of a Senator in the United States Senate, on Saturday the 3d inst.

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Wharton then submitted the following message:
