By the House of Delegates,
January 5th, 1835.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

His Excellency James Thomas, of St. Mary's county, having been re-elected Governor of this State, we propose, with your concurrence, the appointment of a joint committee of the two houses, to wait on him and inform him of his re-election, and request his attendance in the senate chamber to qualify according to the constitution and form of government of this State. We have appointed Messrs. Sothoron, and Hood, to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by your honorable body.

Mr. Dorsey submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice be instructed to inquire into the expediency of providing by law, that whenever an executor, administrator, or guardian, offers to pass in the Orphan's Court his final account with the parties interested in the estate or ward, that the register of wills shall transfer such papers to the county court, and the said court shall issue a summons to the parties interested in the said estate or the ward, to appear by guardian appointed by said court, to show cause why said account should not be allowed, and when thus allowed, shall be final and conclusive by and between the parties.

Which was twice read and rejected.
