On motion of Mr. Pratt,

Ordered, That the committee on colored population be instructed to inquire into the expediency of authorising a deed of manumission from Samuel Peach to George Washington, to be recorded and to declare the same valid.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution in favor of William H. Baldwin, of Anne Arundel county, endorsed "assented to," ordered to be engrossed,— and,

Delivered the annual report of the Treasurer of the Western Shore, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates."

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Also, a communication from Thomas Culbreth, clerk of the Council, enclosing an account of the expenditures and disbursements of the Executive of Maryland, for the year 1834, submitted to the General Assembly, in pursuance of a resolution of December session, 1830, referred by the senate to the consideration of this house.

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Cottman laid before the house a report of the President of St. John's College, in conformity with the act of December session, 1823, chapter 141.

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Beckett, chairman of the committee on claims, delivered the following reports:
