Document No. 3. A correspondence between the Governors of Maryland and Virginia, to be referred to the select committee on the southern and western boundary of Maryland.

Document No. 4. Report of John C. Derickson, Esq. commissioner, and John H. Alexander, Esq. in relation to the survey of the sea coast between Cape Charles and Lewistown Creek, to be referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Document No. 5. Report of the Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, to be referred to the committee on crimes and punishments—and

Document No. 6. Relative to a Portrait of the late Col. John E. Howard, to be referred to the clerk of the Executive Council, to be filed with the Executive papers
