

Mr. Roberts, of Frederick, reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Frederick county, into twelve election districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 112;

Which was read the first and second time, by special order, passed, and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Dulany, chairman of the committee on Insolvency, entitled, An act for the relief of Oramel Tower and Matthew Scott, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, delivered the following report.

The committee on grievances and courts of justice, to whom was referred the leave to bring in a bill concerning the final accounts of executors, administrators and guardians, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report,—that an order, containing the principles proposed by the mover of the leave, to be embodied in said bill, having been submitted to the House, and rejected; the committee deem it unnecessary to report a bill in accordance with the leave, and respectfully ask to be dismissed from the further consideration of the subject.

All which is respectfully submitted.

Mr. Dudley, from the committee, reported the same without amendment.

The said resolution was then read the second time by special order, assented to and returned to the senate.
