On motion of Mr. Cushing,

Ordered, That the standing committee on grievances and courts of justice, be directed to take into their consideration the act of the general assembly, of December session, 1818, chapter 177, entitled, "an act to facilitate the recovery of debts due from the several banks of this state, and to compel the said banks to pay specie for their notes, or forfeit their charters," and to report such amendment, or supplement thereto, as will secure an equitable distribution among the creditors, of the assets of any bank or other monied institution that may become insolvent.

Mr. Moores reported a bill, entitled, An act extending the time of taking the bond of Preston McComas, Sheriff of Harford county;

Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Duvall, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to establish the divisional line between Frederick and Montgomery counties, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Ordered, That the committee on ways and means inquire into the expediency of reducing the tax on billiard tables, so far as relates to Anne Arundel county.
