Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Shower reported a bill, entitled, an act to make public a certain road in Baltimore county;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Key, chairman of the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Beneficial Society;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Key, Chairman of the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Weverton Manufacturing Company, reported the same with the following amendments:

Amendments proposed,

1st. In the eighth section, fourth line, strike out these words, "to forfeit and sell the stock of any delinquent subscriber, and by action of debt, or on motion after ten days notice."

2d. At the end of the bill, add the following as additional sections,

Sec. 9. *And be it further enacted*, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorise the aforesaid company to make, issue, or put into circulation, any negotiable note or notes, payable to bearer, or any note or notes in the nature of a bank note.

Sec. 10. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall be and remain in full force and effect until the year eighteen hundred and sixty, and until the end of the general assembly that shall happen thereafter, or until its charter is revoked by
