

mentioned in the first section of this act, be and the same is hereby relinquished, and vested in the several proprietors of the uplands adjoining thereto, as provided in the second section of this act; and the aforesaid commissioners are hereby required to file with the clerk of Caroline County court, all the deeds of relinquishment and acquisitions of title to any part of said marshes or low grounds, which may be filed with them in virtue of this act, and it shall be the duty of the said clerk, to record amongst the land records of said county, all such deeds and other instruments of writing, which are hereby declared, when so recorded, to be proper and legal evidence of the relinquishments and acquisitions of title, which they may severally express and intend to effectuate.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Wharton,

Ordered, That a select committee of five be appointed by the chair, to inquire into the expediency of establishing within the limits of this state, a deaf and dumb asylum, and that they be authorised to report by bill or otherwise;

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Wharton, Ridgely, Nicols, Annan, and Burchenal, the committee.

The house then adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
