

Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the chairmakers Beneficial society of Baltimore.

Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, chairman of the committee on the colored population, also reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Prince George's County Court, to record a deed therein mentioned;

And, Mr. Cottman, chairman of the committee on education, reported a bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the education of the deaf and dumb, of this State.

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table

The bill reported by Mr. Orrick, regulating fences in Baltimore county, in cases of suits for trespass, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Annan, moved to amend said bill, by inserting in the third line 1st. section, after the word "Baltimore," the word "Frederick,"

Mr. Wyse, moved that said bill be laid on the table and printed.

The question was first put on printing the bill,

Determined in the negative,

The question was then put on lying said bill on the table,

Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an Act to incorporate the Tidy's Island company, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, severally assent to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the resolutions in favour of David Ridgely and Louis Gassaway, severally endorsed, "assented to," ordered to be engrossed,

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an Act to provide for the extension of Lombard street, westerly, and for other purposes,

Which were read and referred to Messrs. Jones of Balt. Cushing, and Ely,

Also, a bill, entitled, an Act authorising officers of the Army or Navy of the United States, to bring their servants, being slaves, into this state,

Which was read and referred to the committee on the coloured population;
