

The bill reported by Mr. Johns, chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, an act to divorce Ann Maria Robinson of Talbot county, from her husband Robert Robinson;

The bill reported by Mr. Cushing, entitled, an act to provide for the opening and extension of Currants Alley in the City of Baltimore;

The bill reported by Mr. Fowler, entitled, an act to extend to Thomas W. Morgan, late collector of Saint Mary's county, further time to complete his collections, and for other purposes,

And, the bill reported by Mr. Orrick, entitled, an act prohibiting Justices of the Peace from exercising their magisterial duties in Bar Rooms of taverns or other public houses of that character, so far as relates to Baltimore county,

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house resumed the consideration of the report and resolutions submitted by Mr. Merrick, chairman of the special committee, in relation to the southern and western boundaries of this State.

On motion of Mr. Ely, the house was called, and the door-keeper sent for the absent members, who after a short time returned and reported, that in obedience to order he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

On motion of Mr. Jones of Somerset, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole house, for the purpose of considering said report and resolutions, and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the chair, when Mr. Nicols, the chairman, reported that said committee had, according to order, had the said report and resolutions under consideration, and having made some progress therein, directed him to ask leave to sit again, which leave was granted by the house.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning at 10 o'clock.
