On motion of Mr. Wells,

Ordered further, that the petition and documents of James Frazier, presented at the last session of the legislature, be withdrawn from the files of the house and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims,

On motion of Mr. Kerby.

Ordered, That the committee on indigent persons by county assessment, enquire into the expediency of placing Sarah Davis on the pension roll of Kent county.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

Ordered, That a committee of three be appointed by the chair, to collect all materials connected with the Colonial History of this state, in any of the public offices, and deposit the same in the Library,

In pursuance whereof the Speaker appointed Messrs. Cottman, Jones of Baltimore, and Williams, the committee.

Mr. Jones of Balt., chairman of the select committee to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an Act to provide for the extension of Lombard street westerly, and for other purposes, reported the same without amendment,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Williams reported a bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the opening of Pratt-st. wharf, in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Brengle, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to establish permanent salaries for the judges of the six judicial-districts in this state.

And, Mr. Duvall reported a bill, entitled, an act to make valid the partition of certain real estate lying in Frederick county, in conformity with the provisions of a certain deed made and executed by and between Henry Clagett and Julia Clagett his wife, of the one part, and Grafton Duvall and Elizabeth W. Duvall his wife, of the other part, bearing date the 25th day of June, 1821, and recorded in Liber I. S. No. 13, folio 545, &c. one of the Land Records of Frederick county aforesaid.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
