Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Cushing also presented a petition of the heirs of the late Talbot Jones, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act, to enable them to have recorded a deed of manumission, therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the colored population;
