No. 13, folio 545, &c. one of the Land Records of Frederick county aforesaid;

Were sent to the senate;

The Speaker laid before the house a report of the trustees of the Manchester United Academy, or School, in Baltimore county, relative to the situation of said academy;

Also, a report of the President of Frederick College, containing a statement of its condition, &c.

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Roberts of Queen Anne's, presented a memorial of John P. Paca, of Queen Anne's county, praying the passage of an act authorising the Levy Court of said county, to examine his accounts, and levy such sum or sums of money as shall appear fairly due and unpaid, as supervisor of a road therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Roberts of Q. Anne's, Larrimore, and Hambleton, of Queen Anne's.

Mr. Wharton presented a petition of sundry citizens of Williamsport, in Washington county, praying the passage of a law authorising the Burgess or Commissioners of said town, to lease or sell a certain piece of ground therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Wharton, Welty, and Kershner.

Mr. Teackle presented a petition of James Handy, Edwin Dashiell, Charles Horsey, and others, of Somerset county, praying that the powers confided to the Levy Court may be exercised by persons elected immediately by the people;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Cottman, and Jones of Somerset.

Mr. Roberts of Frederick, presented a petition of several citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of an act, supplementary to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Trustees of St. Lucas' Reformed Church in Union Town, passed the 3d February, 1819,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Roberts of Frederick, Duvall, and Brengle.

Mr. Jones of Baltimore, presented a petition of Sarah Richards, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Isaiah Richards;
