

On motion of Mr. Pratt,

Ordered, That three hundred copies of the report and eight hundred copies of the map submitted by the Topographical Engineer, be printed.

The house then adjourned until tomorrow morning ten o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 24th 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Hambleton of Talbot, the house took up for consideration the order of the day being the report of the committee of the whole house, in relation to the southern and western boundaries of this state.

On motion of Mr. Hambleton of Talbot, said report was then laid on the table, and made the order of the day for Wednesday next, the 25th inst.

The bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an Act to establish permanent salaries for the judges of the six judicial districts in this state, was sent to the senate.

The Speaker laid before the house a communication from S. C. Leakin and Jos. K. Stapleton, Esqrs. of the city of Baltimore, enclosing a memorial of the convention to promote the trade and commercial interests of the city of Baltimore,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal improvements,

Also, laid before the house a report of the trustees of the Rockville academy, relative to the situation of said academy,

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Teackle, presented a petition of Elijah C. Johnson, William Wailes, Robert Dashiell, and others, of Somerset county, praying that the powers confided to the levy court, may be exercised by persons elected immediately by the people,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Cottman, and Jones of Somerset.

Mr. Nelson, presented a petition of a number of the taxable inhabitants of Harford and Baltimore counties, praying the passage of an act to straighten, alter and amend the old York and Lancaster Road, leading to Baltimore,
